In Florida, there are Standard, Extended Congregate Care (ECC), and Limited Nursing Services (LNS) assisted living licenses.

4). Understand the terms of the contract.

Reviewing contract terms is an important step in the overall process of assisted living facility research. What services are included and which cost extra? Being fully informed about additional fees, including charges for various levels of care, will help you make a well-informed decision. Consider asking your attorney to review the terms and conditions included in the contract in order to avoid future surprises.

5). Have realistic expectations.

Moving to an assisted living facility will be an adjustment. Your 'new normal' will take some time to get used to. Understanding this from the onset will be helpful. If you are a couple, it is always better to move with your spouse or partner so you can make friends and get settled together.
